

Believe it or not, after 15 years of successfully transforming the lives of hundreds of men, many local Vincentians still remain oblivious, ambivalent, and even publically opposed to the



powerful work and ministry of <u>Michael's Place</u>. Michael's Place is our home of hope and recovery for men transitioning from jail to independent living, gainful employment, and personal and spiritual recovery.

My heart breaks when I hear the following comments from brother and sister Vincentians:

- "Michael's Place? Michael's Place? What's that?"
- "Why are we providing twinning funds to a bunch of junkie drug addicts and alcoholics?"
- "Our District Council shouldn't be giving any money to Michael's Place to support those convicts!"

I guess sometimes we forget that Jesus himself was one of those "convicts"! I guess sometimes we forget that Jesus mandates, that's right, mandates that we forgive each other "seventy times seven times"! I guess sometimes we forget our own Rule which explicitly states "No work of charity is foreign to the Society."

Santa Shoebox Project

You are invited to participate in the **2016 Shoebox Santa Project** to support our brothers and sisters in need throughout the state of West Virginia.

The project is simple:

- During October and November, participants solicit shoebox donations from parishioners, friends, family, and work colleagues. The shoeboxes should be filled with a variety of personal toiletry items.
- Donations should be contained in a shoebox and wrapped in Christmas paper (no bows or ribbons). Boxes should be clearly marked on the outside with a "W" for women and a "M" for men.
- Donors may also add a Christmas card inside the box to help add to the recipient's holiday cheer (please do not include cash or gift cards).
- The SVdP Warehouse staff and volunteers will pick-up all donated boxes from your location on Monday, November 21st and Tuesday, November 22nd. They will be delivered to Appalachian Outreach, Inc. on Friday, November 25th.

This is a wonderful way to involve and connect youth, young adults, and families from your parish in the mission and work of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Last year, we collected over 700 Shoeboxes from the Northeast District Council. This year, by involving the entire Diocesan Council of Pittsburgh, we hope to collect 5,000 shoeboxes!

Joining the St. Kilian Conference in 2004, I quickly learned two non-negotiable rules: 1. Weekly meetings. 2. Home visits are mandatory. Little did I realize the importance of Rule #2!

Two years have passed since I received a telephone call from my parish secretary that still leaves me wondering in utter amazement. I was informed that there was an extremely upset woman, whose boyfriend just ended their relationship and rendered her too distraught to drive, who needed help getting food



for her cats. Shaking my head, my demeanor suddenly changed when I heard, "She threatened to take her life!"

From the Society's beginning, the central and most basic activity of Conferences has been the visitation of the needy in their homes. This is the clearest symbol of our Vincentian charism, which dictates the highest respect for the dignity of the poor. It symbolizes our Vincentian commitment to reach out to the needy, rather than require them to report to an outside service site. In the home, needy persons feel most free to confide their stories of struggle. In that family setting, Vincentians are asked to listen, offer humble advice, and render assistance. (The Manual, Section 2.1)
